

A little 6-year-old girl came to us with a swollen cheek and terrible tooth pain.


On checking her teeth, we found one badly infected tooth and many others full of cavities.

The condition is called early childhood decay—something that can quietly affect kids if not caught early.

With the right care, her pain is gone, and she's on her way to a healthy, happy smile again.

Treatment Done



Treatments done :

Pulpectomy (Root Canal for Kids' Teeth)

- Many teeth had deep infection reaching the inner part of the tooth.
- We cleaned it out and saved the tooth with gentle kids' root canal procedure, so she could continue using it for chewing.

Extraction + Space Maintainer


- One tooth was too damaged to be saved and had to be removed.
- To make sure her future permanent tooth grows properly in that place, we placed a small appliance called a space maintainer. It keeps the gap open until the new tooth comes in.

Composite Fillings for Canines

- Her canines (pointed teeth) had cavities.
- We restored them with tooth-colored fillings, making them strong and functional again.

Stainless Steel Crowns

- Some teeth were badly broken down (mutilated crown structure).
- We protected them with durable stainless steel crowns, which restored their strength and allowed the child to chew comfortably again.
